



This is the home page where a user is signed in (the view would probably not differ for a signed out user except "Switch Accounts" would be "Sign Up" and "Logout" would be "Login").

This page serves as an introduction with what they can do with this family history website. It encourages users to sign up.




This search page allows users (signed in and signed out) to search for existing members.

The page also allows users to invite new people to sign up on the website and add new members to their family tree.



This profile from the search results page shows what a profile would look like when the user is not logged in. When users are not logged in, they cannot see confidential health records, just basic information.




This Family page shows the user's family tree when signed in (signed out users do not have family tree data to show).

The user can click on any person in the family tree to show their profile information.

This page also supports adding new family members.


The "?" profile may act as a child prediction profile (what they may inherit, ex: brown eyes or blue eyes, etc.).




This is adding a new member profile page.

This allows the user to create a new family member in their family tree.

It collects relevant information that can later be analyzed and tell the user how it relates to them (ex: hereditary traits or diseases).



This page shows a family member's profile relevant to the user. It shows the person's basic information, and then the person's health records. If something is hereditary, it shows the possibility of the user having it as well. Also shows any notes and documents saved for that profile.



This page shows the user's profile.

It shows basic information that can be edited or added, editable health records, and editable notes and documents.

The health records have relevant links that educate the user on their body.
